Program Details:

- Must be at least 3 years old by September 1, 2024.
- Potty-trained preferred (will accept students in training with pull-ups).
- A small snack will be provided.
- Students will be asked to bring in supplies (a list will be available by July 15).
- This is a full school year program with two payment semesters, fall and winter. It is expected that families that enroll in the fall semester also have the intention to register for the winter semester (payment due by December 31).
- There is a \$50 non-refundable registration fee included in the program cost.
- No refund requests will be honored after August 1, 2024.
