OLD BUSINESS

1. Plastic Film Recycling Quantities

Director Dearborn said that from March to May, there was 240 lbs of plastic collected. Festival on Green Bay Road is still taking them. We did not collect during the closing of the building.

2. Community Garden Sales

Mr. Wise said that all the plots at Schildt are full. Wittmann Park still has 4 plots that people have backed out from this summer. There are two plots, 8 and 10, that constantly gets flooded and therefore no one wants them. Mr. Wise asked that the parks would seed it. Plots 14 and 17 are also vacant with growing of very tall grass. He will ask the park to mow and tilth those plots and plant pumpkins for the fall. Mr. Wise also mentioned that he will not be ordering signs this year to save on money and feels as though they are not needed.

3. Fox River Cleanup

Director Dearborn said this will be August 22nd like mentioned before and that there will be an email coming about it.

4. LED Lights

Chairman Koeppe said that this project is on its way to convert the Village's lights to LED lights. The first round will be 300 lights. They will be placed in different areas throughout the village. They are energy efficient, WE energies does not have to maintain them.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Reappointments of Sustainability Members

Director Dearborn said that everyone on the Sustainability Committee will be reappointed.

2. Leaf Burning Ordinance

Director Dearborn shared with the committee that the Village will be looking into an ordinance to prohibit the burning of leaves.

Ms. Yang explained how she looked at all the ordinances in the surrounding areas and the Village is one of the last to prohibit this action. She put together and ordinance with recommendations from the Fire and Police Chief and the Village Manager.

Chairman Koeppe explained how there will be a workshop to discuss this ordinance, but there will be no changes in the near future yet.

There was a discussion on manpower and the funding of the leaf vacuum.
