<u>Minutes</u>

1. Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, and Roll Call

Meeting called to order by President Youngquist at 6:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

a) <u>Introduction and Oath of Office of Fox Crossing Police Officer Joseph Kotloski – Police Chief</u> <u>Scott Blashka</u>

Chief Blashka introduced the newest Police Officer for Fox Crossing and gave his professional background. Chief Blashka administered the Oath of Office, and Officer Kotloski's wife pinned his badge on his uniform.

b) <u>Winnebago County Economic Recycling Update – Winnebago County Recycling Specialist</u> <u>Jessica Hanson</u>

Specialist Hanson gave a presentation on the financials relevant to Fox Crossing from a recycling standpoint. She stated that approximately 14% of materials that are currently in the waste landfill could have been collected in single stream recycling. From 2020-2021, Fox Crossing's Municipal Solid Waste totaled 4,850 tons which includes 1,829 tons of Organics/Food Waste and 669 tons of uncaptured recycling. Fox Crossing's recycling for that same timeframe totaled 1,329 tons which is in line with other local municipalities on a lb. per resident basis. Fox Crossing received a recycling rebate of \$38,471 in the 2020-2021 year, however there was \$41,800 in lost revenue in recycling that was landfilled.
