MINUTES

Chairman Koeppe stated that we collected 174 lbs. of plastic film in August.

Chairman Koeppe reminded all of the October 8th Electronics Recycling Event. He also stated that this reminder will go out at the next Village Board meeting on September 12th.

Dan Dieck reported that there has been a number of gardeners that have reported theft in their gardens. He stated that these issues are centered primarily in Schildt Park, but that there has also been a complaint from Wittmann Park. There was discussion regarding how much was being taken, and the possibility to adding trail cameras, solar spotlights, and/or signs.

Director Dearborn shared that he has been communicating with IT for potential trail cameras.

Chairman Koepple gave an update on the leak at the water station next to plot #4 in Wittmann Park. He stated that it was an actual underground leak, and that the Utility Department repaired the leak. There has been no complaints since.

Chairman Koepple shared the Fox Cities and Greater Outagamie County Housing Strategy Report that was released just this year. There was discussion pertaining to the report and affordable housing.
