MESSAGE FROM THE VILLAGE PRESIDENT

2024 was another year of major accomplishments in the Village of Fox Crossing, including the completion of numerous capital projects.

By far the most significant construction project completed during 2024 was the long-awaited urbanization of Jacobsen Road between Irish Road and County Highway CB. Jacobsen Road was converted from a dark, narrow passage with dangerous, deep ditches, and significant bicycle/pedestrian traffic on the main road. Urbanizing Jacobsen Road with a bicycle/pedestrian trail, curb and gutter, storm water mains and improved lighting resulted in **IMPROVED SAFETY**. The actual road is wider, deep ditches have been eliminated, a safe walking/biking trail has been added along with the curb and gutter and storm water issues have been greatly reduced.

With grant assistance from the Fox Cities Convention and Visitors Bureau Tourism Development fund, we installed a kayak rental facility at Fritse Park during 2024. In addition, we installed a quiet water launch facility at the park which is universally accessible for all individuals.

During 2024, our Clerk and Deputy Clerk oversaw four elections. Overall, the elections were conducted with very little disruption of any kind. This included the recently completed Presidential election, which resulted in a turnout of 88% of the Village's eligible voters. My compliments for a great job performance by our Clerk, Deputy Clerk and the numerous poll workers.

My wishes are extended to all Fox Crossing residents for good health and prosperity during 2025 and a wonderful Holiday season.

- Please have the "cut end" toward the road for easier handling.

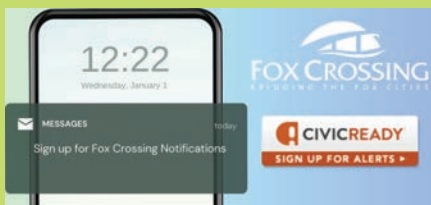

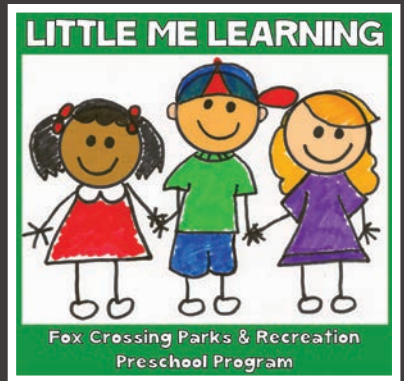

VILLAGE CAPITAL PROJECTS - 2025

As residents in the Midwest say: "There are two seasons every year - Winter and Construction". The Village will have several construction projects completed during 2025 in continuing efforts to improve our infrastructure. These projects range from our annual street improvement projects to singular road reconstruction projects to park improvements to major road and utility construction projects. Below highlights three of the major road and utility construction projects residents can expect to encounter in 2025:

- 1. Valley Road Utility Improvements** - This project is a relay of sanitary sewer and water main piping along Racine Road and Valley Road from approximately Century Oaks Drive to Appleton Road (STH 47). This project is necessary to move and improve our utilities ahead of the reconstruction of Valley Road, which is anticipated to occur in 2026 by Winnebago County. The project began in November 2024 and is expected to be completed in Spring 2025.
- 2. Margeo Neighborhood Utilities and Stormwater Pond** - This project consists of constructing a regional stormwater pond at the northwest corner of CTH CB and Winchester Road (CTH II), installing storm sewer from the stormwater pond to Irish Road via Margeo Drive, and replacing sanitary sewer and water main piping on Margeo Drive,

Bondow Drive, Beverly Court, and Oakview Drive. This project is anticipated to begin in Spring 2025 and be completed in Fall 2025.

- 3. Clayton Avenue Sanitary Sewer and Water Main Extension** - This project consists of installing approximately 2,800 feet of both sanitary sewer and water main along Clayton Avenue north of Shady Lane. Additionally, a drainageway culvert located just north of Shady Lane is anticipated to be replaced. This project is anticipated to begin in Spring 2025 and be completed in Summer 2025.

DIAL-A-RIDE PROGRAM

2025 DOG/CAT LICENSING

All dogs and cats over five months of age are to be vaccinated and licensed. The fees are \$7.00 for neutered/spayed, or \$12.00 for non-neutered/spayed.

Dog/Cat Licenses expire yearly on December 31. In order to avoid the late penalty fee of \$5.00, licenses must be obtained by **March 31, 2025**.



If you become a Village resident after March 31, 2025, the penalty will not apply. Please refer to www.foxcrossingwi.gov for further information.

Pet Licensing Fee Payment Options:

By Mail & Night Deposit Box:

Remit your payment, along with a copy of your pet's rabies vaccination certificate and proof of sterilization from a licensed veterinarian, if applicable. Include a self-addressed, stamped envelope for return of the license and certification information. 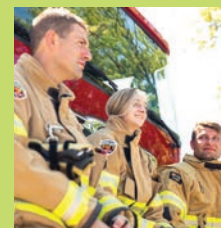

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CHIPPING AND YARD WASTE

Brush and Tree Chipping and Yard Waste are different as indicated on the calendar. Here's how to tell the difference between the two:

CHIPPING

- Performed by Fox Crossing Street Department.
- Brush & Branches shall be a minimum of 3 feet in length and shall not exceed 6 inches in diameter. The longer the branch is, the easier and safer it is for our crews to handle.
- All branches & brush will be neatly and loosely placed off along the shoulder of the road with the 'cut' end of the branches facing the roadway.
- **Please note, starting in 2025, the summer chipping program will be by request only.**

YARD WASTE

- Performed by Harter's Fox Valley Disposal.
- Yard Waste includes leaves, bundled twigs and sticks, roots or shrubs with intact root balls, clean woody vegetative material, and garden debris (no mulch or grass).
- Yard waste must be placed out in biodegradable yard waste paper bags or containers with lifting handles (30 gallon capacity or smaller).

OPEN BOOK & BOARD OF REVIEW

*Frequently Asked Questions from
Accurate Appraisal LLC*

How does the assessment process work?

January 1st - All properties are assessed as it existed on this date. (If new construction is not complete as of January 1st, a partial assessment will be applied for that year). After the assessor has reviewed all assessment work for the year, value change notices are sent to those properties that had a value change. Open Book is held after the value change notices have been sent in the event a property owner has any questions. Board of Review is typically held in the Village in June. To attend the Board of Review an intent to appear must be filed with the municipal clerk no later than 48 hours prior to the meeting.

I received a Notice of Value Change and do not agree with the Property Assessments, what do I do?

Attend Open Book!! Open Book is a time for residents to look at their property assessments in the roll books. If you feel you want to dispute your assessments at the Board of Review, you must have attended Open Book first. It is recommended that you contact the Assessor's office first, prior to taking any action; you may be able to settle over the phone or in person without having to come to Open Book.

My value changed last year. Why did it change again this year?

Annual Interim Market Updates are performed every year in your community. The entire municipality is reviewed and all values brought to current market value as of January 1st. Your annual value is based on recent arms-length comparable property sales in the area. The real estate market changes every year; Accurate Appraisal adjusts the assessed values to keep up with the market. Permits are also taken into consideration and the value added if enhancements were made to your property before January 1 each year.

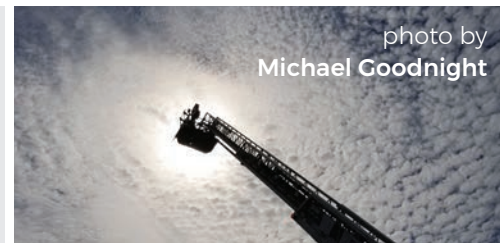

SWIMMING POOLS

The Village of Fox Crossing requires a permit for permanent and temporary pools. This is any pool that can hold 24" of water or more. In addition we have a number of requirements to keep you, your family and neighborhood safe. This does include our new regulations on pool covers in lieu of a fence for in ground permanent pools. A few of the rules include; it must meet the standards of the ATSM, cover must be placed on when not in use, motorized with a manual backup in case of power failure and lockable. 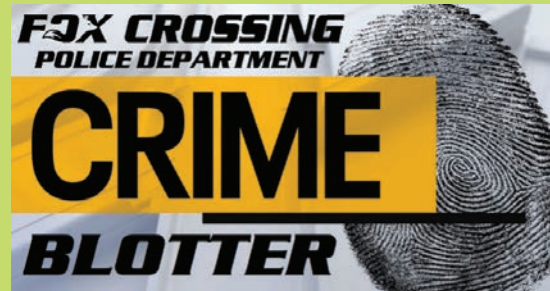

- Respect "No Peddlers/Solicitors" Signs
- Only Approach at the Front Entrance
- Leave premises when asked to do so

Each year since 1985, Americans have celebrated National Park and Recreation Month in July to recognize the importance of parks and recreation in establishing and maintaining the quality of life for, and contributing to, the physical, economic and environmental well-being of communities. Keep an eye out for ways the Parks & Recreation Department will be celebrating, and join in the fun!



TRAIL ETIQUETTE

The Village of Fox Crossing supports and maintains over 20 miles of recreational and bicycle/pedestrian trails. Here are friendly trail etiquette reminders so everyone can have a positive trail experience.

ALL TRAILS

All trail guests – stay to the right, the traffic is two-way.

Just like on the road, faster trail users should pass slower users on the left. Before you reach them, be sure to give an audible warning with a bell, or call out "on your left!" This will give them time to clear the way.

At busy areas, walk no more than two abreast.

Pets on the trail are permitted to be on a leash. Please remove/clean up all pet waste.

Stop, look and listen for motor traffic before crossing the road.

Don't litter along the trails.

TRESTLE TRAIL

Fishermen – fish from the fishing platform and other bump-outs only. No fishing is permitted from the trail.

All trail guests – no stopping or standing on the bridge, and please use the bump-out areas.

REMEMBER - ONLY RAIN IN OUR DRAINS

It's very important to remember that our stormwater drains are only for rain or snowmelt. Other substances such as grass clippings, leaves, pet waste or pesticides can enter our waterways and can cause algal blooms.

Helpful tips for keeping our stormwater drains clean:

- Sweep up after 4th of July festivities. Rain will wash pollutants into nearby storm drains and into our waterways.
- Use organic phosphorus-free fertilizers for your lawns / landscaping. Phosphorus causes excessive growth of algae and aquatic plants.
- Pick up and dispose properly of pet waste while on walks and at home. Pet waste can pollute local waterways during rain or snowmelt events.
- Sweep grass clippings off the road and sidewalk and onto the lawn. Grass clippings contain phosphorus which feeds the algal blooms in our lakes and streams.
- Leave leaves on the ground or lawn, unless necessary for pick up collection. You can also use leaves as mulch or compost.
- Use biodegradable soap when washing your car at home and, wash your car on your lawn or on unpaved areas to avoid wash water flows from entering storm drains.

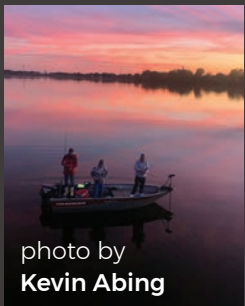

NATIONAL NIGHT OUT

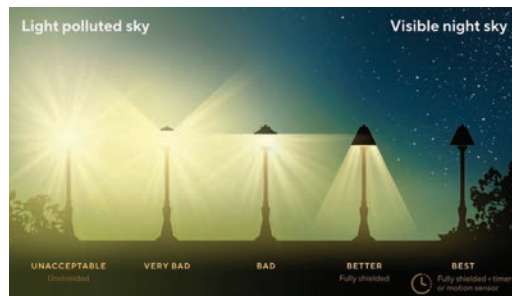

VILLAGE BUDGET INFORMATION

During August and September, Village department heads work with the Finance Director and Village Manager to prepare the next year's fiscal budget request. During October, the budget is presented to the Village Board through a series of workshops (open meetings). This format provides a forum for the Board to have the budget presented to them, to ask questions of Village Staff, and to learn more detailed information about each Departments' requests.

Late in November the final budget, taking into account changes from the workshop sessions and new or updated information, will be presented at a public hearing for final discussion. The Village Board then convenes a Special Board Meeting to adopt the budget by resolution and set the tax levy.

LOOSE LEAF FALL PROGRAM POLICY

The "Loose Leaf Fall Collection Program" will start the week of October 20 and end on December 5. Leaves are collected in the fall using village equipment and village staff. Residents are asked to put their leaves out at least 48 hours prior to your garbage day. This will help with garbage carts not being in the way of pick up.

For all curb and gutter areas of the village, residents must place loose leaves (no bags) onto the terrace area, along the curb line, and within 8' of the back of curb for leaves to be collected. There is no height restriction on the height of the leaf piles.

In areas with ditches (no curb & gutter), residents must place loose leaves (no bags) along the front slope area of the roadway between the edge of shoulder (not on the shoulder) and the center of the ditch line. Please do not place leaves in the ditch line which could block drainage. We ask residents to avoid filling up ditch areas with leaves. Doing so will help avoid flooding issues. More importantly, it will avoid problems with the collection of the leaves. When the leaves are wet there is the possibility equipment will plug up, which creates more work and down time for the staff.

Once the program starts, continue to place leaves out for pick-up. This will help crews stay on schedule when the leaves begin to get heavy and work slows down due to the volume of leaves. Remember you may also put your leaves in bags for Harter's to pick up on the designated weeks on the calendar that say Yard Waste. Burning of leaves is no longer permitted in the Village of Fox Crossing!

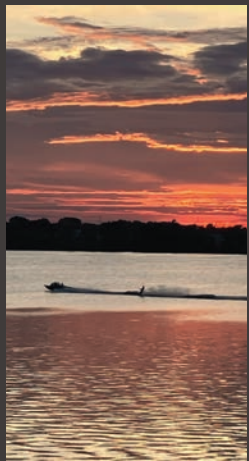

AUTOMATED GARBAGE & RECYCLING REMINDERS

Carts must be placed 3-5 feet away from each other and any other obstacle (mailbox, tree, parked vehicle, etc.) The automated arm that picks up your garbage & recycling cart needs 3-5 feet of clearance.

Whenever possible, place your carts at the end of the driveway the night before your garbage day or, at the latest, by 6:00am on your collection day. ***The trucks will not come back to empty carts that were placed out after the trucks have been through your neighborhood.***

When placing your carts out for collection, make sure the cart lid opening is facing the road and the cart handle is facing your house. Carts that are placed backwards will not be emptied.

Place all miscellaneous GARBAGE items (fast food bags, wrappers, paper drinking cups, etc.) inside a garbage bag for proper disposal within your GARBAGE cart.

Cardboard must be broken down into 3ft x 3ft sections and be placed inside your recycling cart. Do NOT tie/bundle cardboard or any other paper recyclables.

REMINDER: Make sure you are recycling **all** plastic containers, milk/juice cartons, produce, deli, dairy & bakery containers/cartons.



Do not use or place plastic bags of any kind in your RECYCLING cart! All recyclables must be commingled (placed loosely) inside your recycling cart. Recycle plastic bags at stores that accept them for recycling. Styrofoam is NOT a recyclable item.

WINTER PARKING ORDINANCE

The Village does not permit overnight parking on all public roadways between November 1 - April 1 from 2AM-5AM in order to allow effective, unobstructed plow operation and snow removal during this period of little to no vehicular traffic. A snow emergency can be issued when snow is falling in such a manner as to produce a congestion of traffic or impede the operation of emergency vehicles. In the event of a declared snow emergency, parking on Village roadways is prohibited until the emergency is deemed over.

To Qualify: You must own a home in Wisconsin AND your home must have been occupied as a PRIMARY residence on January 1, 2024. A primary residence is defined as the home in which a property owner lives for more than six months of the year. If temporarily away, a primary residence is the home to which the owner returns.

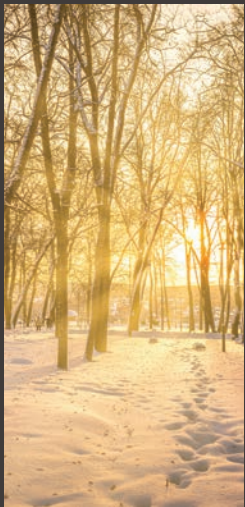

- **Light green writing**.....Christmas tree collection week is for EVERYONE in the village except businesses.
- **Blue writing**.....Chipping weeks are for EVERYONE in the village except businesses.
- **Orange writing**.....Summer Chipping Program- Request service only. Please fill out online form for request.
- **Red writing**.....Yard waste weeks are for EVERYONE in the village except businesses.
- **Dark green writing**.....Leaf Vac weeks are for EVERYONE in the village except businesses.
- **Summer Chipping Request Form Must be filled out and submitted by 11:59PM the Thursday prior to the Chipping week!**

- * Garbage/Recycling/Yard Waste/Christmas tree collection is done by Harter's and could change a pickup day due to a holiday.
- * Carts must be placed curbside by 6:00AM. Place your carts out the night before collection day to avoid being missed!
- * Garbage is picked up weekly. Recycling is picked up bi-weekly.
- * Visit our website or call the street department to determine if your recyclables are collected on "A" or "B" weeks.
- * **PLEASE NOTE: Last leaf collection for 2025 will be the week of December 1st on your garbage day.**

HELPFUL INFORMATION

◆ CART PLACEMENT

- * Must be 3-5 feet away from each other and from any obstacle (ie: mailbox, parked car on roadway, etc).
- * Must be placed curbside by 6:00 am (**placed curbside the night before collection is recommended**).
- * The front of the cart (where the serial number is printed) must face the road.
- * Lids must close completely on the carts.
- * **Winter placement:** On your driveway after you have cleared it of snow. **DO NOT** place on top of snow banks!
- * If your cart is tagged for a violation, it will not be collected until your next regularly scheduled collection day.
- * Carts must be returned to their point of storage prior to 8:00am on the day following your collection day.

◆ CURBSIDE RECYCLING

- * Place all recyclable materials loose in the recycling cart.
- * **DO NOT** use, or dispose of, plastic bags of any kind in your recycling cart.
- * Plastic motor oil bottles are **NOT** recyclable! Put plastic motor oil bottles in the trash.
- * Excess paper recyclables and cardboard boxes can be dropped off (at no charge) in the crates at:
Paper Valley Recycling - 1420 Earl St, Menasha, Mon - Fri between 7:00a - 3:00p.

◆ HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Items can be taken to the Winnebago County Recycling Facility by appointment - Call or visit the County website for details.

Acceptable Household Hazardous items:

- Automotive** - fuel additives, transmission, brake and starter fluids.
- Cleaners** - drain, oven and household; turpentine, solvents, varnish/stain, pool chemicals, polishes and aerosol sprays.
- Lawn/Garden** - herbicides, insecticides, fungicides, weed killer, and poisons.
- Misc.** - oil & lead based paint, grease & rust, solvents, paint thinners/strippers, adhesives/driveway sealer, wood preservatives, spray paint, mercury.

◆ Electronics can be taken to Winnebago County Recycling Facility 920-232-1800

- * Televisions - less than 32" (**Residential Only - Limit 4**) - \$15.00/each
- * Televisions - 32" or greater (**Residential Only - Limit 4**) - \$20.00/each
- * Keyboard, mouse, speakers, cords, cell phones (**Residential Only**) - no charge
- * Monitor, laptop, CPU, printer, DVD player, VCR (**Residential Only - Limit 4**) - \$5.00/each

◆ PAINT

Latex paint - once the paint is dry, put the cover back on and dispose of in the trash
(paint can be dried by allowing it to air dry or by adding sand, kitty litter or latex paint hardener).
Oil and Lead based paint - treat as Household Hazardous Waste.

◆ BULKY ITEM COLLECTION

Local Salvage Dealer – Check the phone directory for local dealers who will dispose of your items.

◆ **Harter's Fox Valley Disposal - Call 1-888-804-8556 to make arrangements for this curbside service:**

- * White goods with refrigerants (refrigerator, freezer, air-conditioner, dehumidifier) - \$85.00

◆ **SHREDDED PAPER COLLECTION**

* **Shredded paper cannot be placed in your recycling cart.**

- * Shredded paper can be thrown in your regular garbage bin in a bag.
- * Shredded paper can be taken to Oshkosh Paper Salvage @ 1860 Harrison St., Oshkosh, WI 54901, (920)-235-2000 for free. There is a row of blue curbside recycling carts that shredded papers can be placed in.

◆ **USED ENGINE OIL DROP-OFF SITE - Fox Crossing Municipal Complex**

- * Clean used engine oil only.
- * Drop-off site is open 24/7.
- * Drop-off site is monitored by security cameras.
- * You MUST take your empty containers home with you.
- * *Drop-off site is located on the west side of the Municipal Complex. Look for the large, white holding tank.*

◆ **TREE AND BRUSH CHIPPING - performed by street laborers**

- * Tree & brush material will be collected on your regular garbage collection day, as indicated on the calendar under "chipping".
- * **Starting in 2025, the summer program will only be requested pick-up only!**
- * Tree & brush material must be placed curbside by 6:00am & no earlier than 48 hours prior to your regular garbage day.
- * In the event village crews can't complete the collection route on your scheduled day, collection will continue the following day until the routes are completed.
- * Place branch piles in a single row with all "cut ends" toward the road; piles shall not exceed 5 ft. in height; branches cannot exceed 6 inches in diameter. Keep branches long for the safety of our crew.
- * If you missed your scheduled collection, you can take the material to the drop-off site at 2000 Municipal Dr.
- * Violations of the Tree and Brush Chipping Policy will be tagged. Failure to remove such material within 24 hours could result in a citation being issued for violation of Village of Fox Crossing Ordinance 10.03(7).
- * If you hire a professional service to cut down a tree(s)/brush, they shall remove the materials.
- * The entire Tree and Brush Chipping Program Policy can be found on the village's website.

◆ **YARD WASTE & LEAF COLLECTION - performed by Harter's Fox Valley Disposal**

- * Yard waste/leaf collection occurs every other week, on your garbage day, as indicated on the calendar.
- * Yard waste includes: leaves, bundled twigs and sticks (bundles are not to exceed 4 ft. in length, 2 inches in diameter and must weigh less than 50 pounds), roots or shrubs with intact root balls, clean woody vegetative material no greater than 6 inches in diameter and garden debris (no mulch or grass).
- * Use biodegradable yard waste paper bags or containers with lifting handles (30 gallon capacity or smaller).
- * **Yard waste in plastic bags are BANNED from the landfill & will NOT be picked up curbside.**
- * **Grass clippings and mulch are NOT collected by The Village of Fox Crossing or Harter's ever.**
- * **Grass clippings/mulch/leaves/yard waste are NOT accepted at the Tree & Brush Drop-Off Center.**
- * Grass clippings can be taken to the Winnebago County Landfill in Oshkosh or the Outagamie County Landfill in Appleton.

◆ **UNWANTED / EXPIRED (PRESCRIPTION & OVER-THE-COUNTER) MEDICATION DISPOSAL**

PLEASE DO NOT FLUSH MEDICATIONS DOWN THE DRAIN OR THROW IN THE TRASH!
