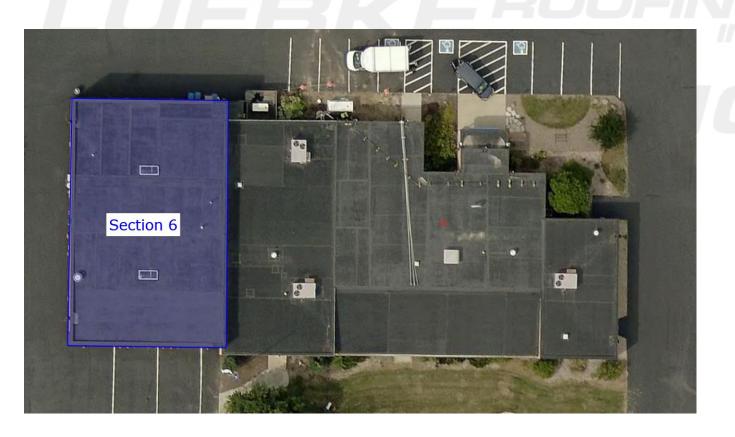

- 3. A more accurate lead time can be presented after Signature is received and order has been Approved by production.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Additional necessary repairs will be charged at material cost + 20% and labor at \$95 per man hour. This includes possible hidden conditions such as deteriorated roof decking, hidden shingle layers, flashing problems, other rotted wood, etc.
- 2. Down payment is required to execute the signed contract. Standard down payment of 30% is typical with progress payments expected throughout the project. Remaining balance and or change orders will be due upon completion.
