MINUTES

Chair Koepp introduced an idea that the committee members could bring a topic on sustainability to spend 10-15 minutes discussing together. He handed out a copy of an article on trends in hurricanes over time. There was a brief discussion.

OLD BUSINESS

Dan Dieck updated the committee on the community gardens and said there were 4 garden plots that were not renewed and will be available for 2025, two in each park. He also said there is a 10-person waiting list for Wittmann Park and 20 people on the waiting list for Schildt Park.

NEW BUSINESS

Chair Koepp mentioned there is an open seat on the committee and asked if the open seat should be advertised on the village website, consensus was yes. Dan Dieck reported that there were a few updates to the sustainability section of the village website and some ongoing efforts will continue. Chair Koepp and George Dearborn will look at the SolSmart program for consideration of its bronze level.

OTHER BUSINESS

George Dearborn informed the committee that Wild Ones are bringing a CSM to the Planning Commission that would separate its house/office from the rest of the property and the organization intends to sell it as a residential home. There was some discussion.

A motion was made by Tracy Romzek and seconded by Thomas Willecke to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously.
