## MESSAGE FROM THE VILLAGE PRESIDENT

2025 was another year of major accomplishments in the Village of Fox Crossing, including the completion of numerous capital projects.

The Village completed the reconstruction of Winchester Road from the Railroad Tracks to Lake Street, which was a much needed improvement for the efficiency and safety of the corridor. Additionally, the Village extended water and sanitary sewer utilities on Clayton Avenue, conducted sanitary sewer improvements in the Silverwood Lane/Shreve Lane neighborhood, and replaced aged water and sanitary sewer mains in the Margeo Drive/Oakview Drive neighborhood.

Also during 2025, the Village completed the necessary utility improvements on Valley Road in preparation for Winnebago County's upcoming Valley Road Reconstruction project coming in 2026.

Furthermore, the Village once again advanced towards meeting Department of Natural Resources (DNR) requirements by constructing the Margeo Regional Stormwater Pond near the intersection of CTH CB and Winchester Road, to improve stormwater runoff in the area.

We continued to invest in our wonderful park system by replacing the play equipment at Westfield Park and conducting a play equipment overhaul at O'Hauser Park. These are meaningful improvements to the park system and I hope that all residents get the opportunity to check out the new amenities.

I hope all have a blessed and safe holiday season and extend best wishes of good health and prosperity in 2026!



## FIRE SAFETY TIPS – CARBON MONOXIDE AWARENESS

- Test monthly; replace devices per manufacturer guidance or at 7–10 years.
- If the alarm sounds, move outside and call 911. Do not re-enter until cleared.



## BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR – PICK UP PET WASTE

As a pet owner, please be respectful and pick up all pet waste! If your dog poops, you must scoop! Failure to remove or dispose of excreta left or deposited by a dog can result in a \$149.20 fine. Fox Crossing ordinances require all pets to be leashed when walking in public places, including Village roadways and designated trails.

No garbage can nearby? Please take the bag home with you, do not leave it behind for others to deal with.

## 2026 DOG/CAT LICENSING

All dogs and cats over five months of age are to be vaccinated and licensed. The fees are \$7.00 for neutered/spayed, or \$12.00 for non-neutered/spayed.

Dog/Cat Licenses expire yearly on December 31. In order to avoid the late penalty fee of \$5.00, licenses must be obtained by March 31, 2026.



If you become a Village resident after March 31, 2026, the penalty will not apply. Please refer to [www.foxcrossingwi.gov](http://www.foxcrossingwi.gov) for further information.

### Pet Licensing Fee Payment Options:

#### By Mail & Night Deposit Box:

Remit your payment, along with a copy of your pet's rabies vaccination certificate and proof of sterilization from a licensed veterinarian, if applicable. Include a self-addressed, stamped envelope for return of the license and certification information. The night deposit box is located just to the left of the main entrance doors at the Municipal Building. Otherwise, payments can be mailed to:

#### In Person:

Licenses can be obtained at the Municipal Building, Finance Department, 2000 Municipal Drive (corner of E. Shady Lane and County Hwy CB). When applying for a license, owners must present a rabies vaccination certificate and proof of sterilization (if applicable) from a licensed veterinarian. **No license will be issued without proper certification.**

#### No Longer have your Dog or Cat?

## DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CHIPPING AND YARD WASTE

Brush and Tree Chipping and Yard Waste are different as indicated on the calendar. Here's how to tell the difference between the two:

### CHIPPING

- Performed by Fox Crossing Street Department.
- Brush & Branches shall be a minimum of 3 feet in length and shall not exceed 6 inches in diameter. The longer the branch is, the easier and safer it is for our crews to handle.
- All branches and brush shall be neatly and loosely placed off along the shoulder of the road with the 'cut' end of the branches facing the roadway.
- **Summer Chipping and Fall Chipping Programs will be by request only. If a request is not made, the Village crews will not stop at your property.**

### YARD WASTE

- Performed by Harter's Fox Valley Disposal.
- Yard Waste includes leaves, bundled twigs and sticks, roots or shrubs with intact root balls, clean woody vegetative material, and garden debris (no mulch or grass).
- Yard waste must be placed out in biodegradable yard waste paper bags or containers with lifting handles 30 gallon capacity or smaller).

## FIRE SAFETY TIPS - SPRING HOME & YARD SAFETY

- Inspect power tools and outdoor cords before use. Replace any with frayed wires or damaged plugs.
- Clean around outdoor AC units, grills, and vents to remove leaves or debris that could block airflow or ignite.
- Store gasoline, propane, and fertilizers safely in approved containers away from direct sunlight and ignition sources.



## UNDERSTANDING YOUR PROPERTY ASSESSMENT:

### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Each year, your property is assessed to ensure its value reflects current market conditions. Here's a quick overview of how the process works and what steps you can take if you have questions or concerns about your assessment.

#### How the assessment process works:

- All properties are assessed as they exist on January 1 each year. If your home was under construction and not completed by that date, a partial assessment will be applied.
- After assessments are reviewed, Value Change Notices are mailed to property owners whose property values have changed. This is your opportunity to review your new value and ask questions.
- That's where Open Book comes in. Open Book is a designated time for property owners to review their assessment, speak with the assessor, and ask questions or raise concerns. It's a key step in the process and a required one if you plan to contest your assessment later at the Board of Review.

#### What if you disagree with your assessment?

If you receive a Notice of Value Change and don't agree with the new assessed value:

1. Attend Open Book to review your assessment with the assessor.
2. Call the assessor's office. Many concerns can be resolved over the phone.
3. If after speaking with the assessor's office you still wish to formally dispute the value, you must file an intent to appear at the Board of Review with the municipal clerk at least 48 hours before the hearing.

The Board of Review is typically held in June. Keep an eye out for local announcements with exact dates and deadlines.

#### Why does my property value keep changing?

Annual Interim Market Updates are performed each year to reflect changes in the real estate market. The entire municipality is reviewed, and all values brought to current market value as of January 1st. Your assessment is based on recent arms-length sales of similar properties in your area and any permits or improvements made before January 1st. Because the market can shift each year, your property value may increase or decrease accordingly.

#### My assessment increased, what about my property taxes?

Please know that a rise in your property's assessed value does not guarantee a proportional rise in your taxes—your tax bill could even decrease. Your individual tax bill depends on how your property's change compares to the average change across the whole community and the total dollars (the levy) needed by your taxing jurisdictions.

- Only Approach at the Front Entrance
- Leave premises when asked to do so




## SCHOOL BUS SAFETY



# LOOSE LEAF FALL PROGRAM POLICY

The "Loose Leaf Fall Collection Program" will start the week of October 19 and is anticipated to end on December 4. However, the program may end sooner if weather becomes unfavorable. Leaves are collected by the Village's Street Department. It is recommended residents have their leaves out at least 24 hours before their designated garbage day. This will help with garbage carts not being in the way of pick up.

For all curb and gutter areas of the Village, residents must place loose leaves (no bags) onto the terrace area, along the curb line, and within 8' of the back of curb for leaves to be collected. There is no height restriction on the height of the leaf piles.

In areas with ditches (no curb & gutter), residents must place loose leaves (no bags) along the front slope area of the roadway between the edge of shoulder (not on the shoulder) and the center of the ditch line. Residents must not place leaves in the ditch line to avoid filling up ditch areas with leaves and causing flooding issues. Additionally, it will avoid problems with the collection of the leaves. When the leaves are wet there is the possibility equipment will plug up, which creates more work for the crews.

Once the program starts, residents can continue to place leaves out for pick-up. This will help crews stay on schedule when the leaves begin to get heavy and work slows down due to the volume of leaves. **Residents may also put leaves in bags for Harter's to pick up on the designated weeks on the calendar that say Yard Waste.** Burning of leaves is no longer permitted in the Village of Fox Crossing! Residents are encouraged to read the Leaf Collection Programs and Policy for more information, which can be found on the Village's Garbage & Recycling page under the Residents and Visitors tab.

## FIRE SAFETY TIPS - SMOKE ALARMS & FIRE PREVENTION MONTH



- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, hallway, and on every level.
- Test alarms monthly and replace any unit older than 10 years.
- Hold a family fire drill, timing how fast everyone reaches the meeting place.

## DRUG DROP BOX

Too often, unused prescription drugs find their way into the wrong hands. Unused or expired prescription medications are a public safety issue, leading to potential accidental poisoning, misuse, and overdose. That is dangerous and often tragic. Proper disposal of unused drugs saves lives and protects the environment. It's great to see thousands of folks from across the country clean out their medicine cabinets and turn in - safely and anonymously - a record amount of prescription drugs during annual Prescription Drug Take Back Day.

The designated nationally recognized Rx Take Back Days are April 25, 2026 and October 31, 2026.

The Village of Fox Crossing proudly participates, and citizens can actually drop off unwanted prescriptions at the municipal complex year-round during business hours, Monday - Friday, 8AM-4PM.

Please follow these simple rules if you plan to drop off your unused prescriptions:

**1. PRESCRIPTION pills/tablets/creams/liquids ONLY!**

Vitamins, supplements, and health care supplies are not accepted in this program!

2. Place your pills/tablets into sealable plastic bags. If you don't have any, they are provided at the Drug Drop Box.

3. Recycle your pill bottles, and consider removing the labels which may contain sensitive, personal information on them.

4. NO SHARPS! The drug drop box is not a sharps container. Medications in pre-loaded syringes are not accepted, but can be taken to other facilities such as hospital ER's or pharmacies.

## WINTER PARKING ORDINANCE

The Village does not permit overnight parking on all public roadways between November 1 - April 1 from 2AM-5AM in order to allow effective, unobstructed plow operation and snow removal during this period of little to no vehicular traffic. A snow emergency can be issued when snow is falling in such a manner as to produce a congestion of traffic or impede the operation of emergency vehicles. In the event of a declared snow emergency, parking on Village roadways is prohibited until the emergency is deemed over.



## RECYCLING BATTERIES:

Never put Batteries or electronics in your recycling bin or cart! Recycling facilities that handle cans, bottles, paper and cardboard aren't set up to take batteries or electronics. Many batteries, especially lithium-ion batteries that power newer electronics, cause serious fires in recycling trucks and facilities. The Department of Natural Resources recommends recycling many battery types by taking them to a drop-off site. Please scan this QR code to find an electronics or battery collection site near you!

## NOVEMBER | COOKING & HOLIDAY MEAL SAFETY

- Stay in the kitchen when frying, broiling, or boiling.
- Keep kids and pets 3 feet from the stove; turn pot handles inward.

## PROPERTY TAXES

Property tax bills are mailed as soon as they are available, which is typically near the middle of December. The Village allows payment in up to two (2) installments. Payment in full, or the 1st installment amount, are payable to the Village Treasurer by January 31. The 2nd installment, or any payments after January 31, are due to Winnebago County. *The Village of Fox Crossing cannot accept 2nd Installment Payments.*

**Check your tax bill!** If you do not have a Lottery & Gaming credit on your tax bill, you may still be eligible. You can complete the form when making your payment in person at the Village Municipal Complex or refer to the Village webpage above to print the form. The completed form can be returned via mail with your payment to the Village Treasurer prior to January 31.

**To Qualify:** You must own a home in Wisconsin AND your home must have been occupied as a PRIMARY residence on January 1, 2026. A primary residence is defined as the home in which a property owner lives for more than six months of the year. If temporarily away, a primary residence is the home to which the owner returns.

- Red writing..... Yard waste weeks are for EVERYONE in the village that recieves our garbage & recycling services
- Dark green writing..... Leaf Vac weeks are for EVERYONE in the village that recieves our garbage & recycling services
- Summer/Fall Chipping Request Form Must be filled out and submitted by 11:59PM the Thursday prior to the Chipping week!
- Garbage/Recycling/Yard Waste/Christmas tree collection is done by Harter's and could change a pickup day due to a holiday.
- Carts must be placed curbside by 6:00AM. Place your carts out the night before collection day to avoid being missed!
- Garbage is picked up weekly. Recycling is picked up bi-weekly.
- Visit our website or call the street department to determine if your recyclables are collected on "A" or "B" weeks.
- PLEASE NOTE: Weather Depending, last leaf collection for 2026 will be the week of November 30th.

## HELPFUL INFORMATION

### ◆ CART PLACEMENT

- \* Must be 3-5 feet away from each other and from any obstacle (ie: mailbox, parked car on roadway, etc).
- \* Must be placed curbside by 6:00 am (**placed curbside the night before collection is recommended**).
- \* The front of the cart (where the serial number is printed) must face the road.
- \* Lids must close completely on the carts.
- \* **Winter placement:** On your driveway after you have cleared it of snow. **DO NOT** place on top of snow banks!
- \* If your cart is tagged for a violation, it will not be collected until your next regularly scheduled collection day.
- \* Carts must be returned to their point of storage prior to 8:00am on the day following your collection day.

### ◆ CURBSIDE RECYCLING

- \* Place all recyclable materials loose in the recycling cart.
- \* **DO NOT** use, or dispose of, plastic bags of any kind in your recycling cart.
- \* Plastic motor oil bottles are **NOT** recyclable! Put plastic motor oil bottles in the trash.
- \* **Excess paper recyclables and cardboard boxes can be dropped off (at no charge) in the crates at:**  
**1420 Earl St, Menasha, Mon - Fri between 7:00a - 3:00p.**

### ◆ HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Items can be taken to the Winnebago County Recycling Facility by appointment - Call or visit the County website for details.

#### **Acceptable Household Hazardous Items:**

- Automotive*** - fuel additives, transmission, brake and starter fluids.
- Cleaners*** - drain, oven and household; turpentine, solvents, varnish/stain, pool chemicals, polishes and aerosol sprays.
- Lawn/Garden*** - herbicides, insecticides, fungicides, weed killer, and poisons.
- Misc.*** - oil & lead based paint, grease & rust solvents, paint thinners/stripers, adhesives/driveway sealer, wood preservatives, spray paint, mercury.

### ◆ Electronics can be taken to Winnebago County Recycling Facility 920-232-1800

- \* Televisions - less than 32" (**Residential Only - Limit 4**) - \$15.00/each
- \* Televisions - 32" or greater (**Residential Only - Limit 4**) - \$20.00/each
- \* Keyboard, mouse, speakers, cords, cell phones (**Residential Only**) - no charge
- \* Monitor, laptop, CPU, printer, DVD player, VCR (**Residential Only - Limit 4**) - \$5.00/each

### ◆ PAINT

Latex paint - once the paint is dry, put the cover back on and dispose of in the trash

(*paint can be dried by allowing it to air dry or by adding sand, kitty litter or latex paint hardener*).

Oil and Lead based paint - treat as Household Hazardous Waste.

\* **Shredded paper cannot be placed in your recycling cart.**

- \* Shredded paper can be thrown in your regular garbage bin in a bag.
- \* Shredded paper can be taken to Oshkosh Paper Salvage @ 1860 Harrison St., Oshkosh, WI 54901, (920)-235-2000 for free. There is a row of blue curbside recycling carts that shredded papers can be placed in.

◆ **USED ENGINE OIL DROP-OFF SITE - Fox Crossing Municipal Complex**

- \* Clean used engine oil only.
- \* Drop-off site is open 24/7.
- \* Drop-off site is monitored by security cameras.
- \* You **MUST** take your empty containers home with you.
- \* *Drop-off site is located on the west side of the Municipal Complex. Look for the large, white holding tank.*

◆ **TREE AND BRUSH CHIPPING - performed by street laborers**

- \* Tree & brush material will be collected on your regular garbage collection day, as indicated on the calendar under "chipping".
- \* **Summer and Fall Program will be requested pick-up only!**
- \* Tree & brush material must be placed curbside by 6:00am & no earlier than 48 hours prior to your regular garbage day.
- \* In the event village crews can't complete the collection route on your scheduled day, collection will continue the following day until the routes are completed.
- \* Place branch piles in a single row with all "cut ends" toward the road; piles shall not exceed 5 ft. in height; branches cannot exceed 6 inches in diameter. Keep branches long for the safety of our crew.
- \* If you missed your scheduled collection, you can take the material to the drop-off site at 2000 Municipal Dr.
- \* Violations of the Tree and Brush Chipping Policy will be tagged. Failure to remove such material within 24 hours could result in a citation being issued for violation of Village of Fox Crossing Ordinance 10.03(7).
- \* If you hire a professional service to cut down a tree(s)/brush, they shall remove the materials.
- \* The entire Tree and Brush Chipping Program Policy can be found on the village's website.

◆ **YARD WASTE & LEAF COLLECTION - performed by Harter's Fox Valley Disposal**

- \* Yard waste/leaf collection occurs every other week, on your garbage day, as indicated on the calendar.
- \* Yard waste includes: leaves, bundled twigs and sticks (bundles are not to exceed 4 ft. in length, 2 inches in diameter and must weigh less than 50 pounds), roots or shrubs with intact root balls, clean woody vegetative material no greater than 6 inches in diameter and garden debris (no mulch or grass).
- \* Use biodegradable yard waste paper bags or containers with lifting handles (30 gallon capacity or smaller).
- \* Yard waste in plastic bags are **BANNED** from the landfill & will NOT be picked up curbside.
- \* **Grass clippings and mulch are NOT collected by The Village of Fox Crossing or Harter's ever.**
- \* **Grass clippings/mulch/leaves/yard waste are NOT accepted at the Tree & Brush Drop-Off Center.**
- \* Grass clippings can be taken to the Winnebago County Landfill in Oshkosh or the Outagamie County Landfill in Appleton.

◆ **UNWANTED / EXPIRED (PRESCRIPTION & OVER-THE-COUNTER) MEDICATION DISPOSAL**

**PLEASE DO NOT FLUSH MEDICATIONS DOWN THE DRAIN OR THROW IN THE TRASH!**

The Village of Fox Crossing Police Dept has a medication drop box located in the lobby for expired or unwanted human or pet medications in the form of pills, capsules, ointments, liquids, sprays, drops, creams, inhalers or any other drug no longer needed for its intended use. The drop box is available Monday - Friday from 6 am to 6 pm
