**MINUTES**

Michael Scheibe moved and Thomas Willecke seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the July 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2024 Sustainability Committee meeting.

**MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS**

Chairman Koeppe brought up a question from the last meeting. The question was about dollars spent on garbage versus recycling. Chairman Koeppe continued to make comments on the subject.  
Chairman Koeppe mentioned an educational, proper recycling handout that was given to him by Winnebago County. Discussion occurred on how and when to get the handout out to the public.  
Chairman Koeppe reminded the committee of the e-recycling event taking place in October of 2024.

**OLD BUSINESS**

Dan Dieck updated the committee on the community gardens. He informed the committee on the reports of theft at the Schildt Park garden plots. Some discussion occurred between staff and committee members regarding what could be done to prevent this issue from happening.  
Chairman Koeppe discussed sending a donation to Menasha High School for making Garden Markers for the Wittmann Park garden plots. Staff member Dan Dieck brought up how he hasn't seen the markers out yet, thus it was decided to wait on sending a donation until it is confirmed that they're up.

**NEW BUSINESS**

Dan Dieck updated the committee on the new free produce sign for the Schildt Park Community Gardens. He stated that the sign is in the process of being created.  
Chairman Koeppe asked the committee if anyone had suggestions for a new committee member. He also provided an update on the Recycle That Stuff contract.

**OTHER BUSINESS**

Mr. Willecke provided comments on the sustainability website page. He mentioned how he looked at it and suggests that after the new Village website launches, the committee could go through the sustainability page together at a future meeting.
