MINUTES

Thomas Willecke moved and Michael Scheibe seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the August 7th, 2024 Sustainability Committee meeting. (No September quorum)
Motion carried.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

Chairman Koepp advised the Sustainability Committee to review the new Sustainability section of the Village of Fox Crossing website and provide input on what to modify/add to the site.

OLD BUSINESS

Chairman Koepp and Dan Dieck provided an update on the community gardens. They reminded the committee that annual garden plot cleanup will be approaching at the end of the month.

Chairman Koepp updated the committee on the donation for the garden markers created by students from Menasha High School. He suggested that \$225 would be a reasonable amount for the donation, the Committee agreed. Chairman Koepp asked George Dearborn to prepare a check on behalf of the Committee.

NEW BUSINESS

Associate Planner Dieck commented on the free produce sign and recommended that the committee should rethink or rephrase the sign because it may convey the wrong message to gardeners or park users.

Discussion was had regarding the waiting lists for the community gardens. The committee discussed the concern of non-residents who've been participating in the community garden program for several years and the many patrons on the waiting list whom are residents of the Village but haven't had a chance to participate in the program yet.

Chairman Koepp mentioned that the committee is still looking for a new member to join the committee. He suggested that a non-resident may qualify for the position if they're employed within the Village.

Chairman Koepp reported on a question from a resident involving recycling shredded paper. Discussion occurred on how to provide information on the question via the sustainability committee website.

Chairman Koepp reminded the committee of the upcoming e-recycling event taking place on October 12th, 2024.

OTHER BUSINESS

Associate Planner Dieck provided a report on a sustainability initiative called "SolSmart" where local governments receive federal assistance to expand their solar energy use within the community.

Discussion occurred involving the creation of an informational flyer on both recycling and keeping storm water drains clear of harmful pollutants.

ADJOURNMENT

A motion was made by Tracey Romzek and seconded by Michael Scheibe to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously.
